

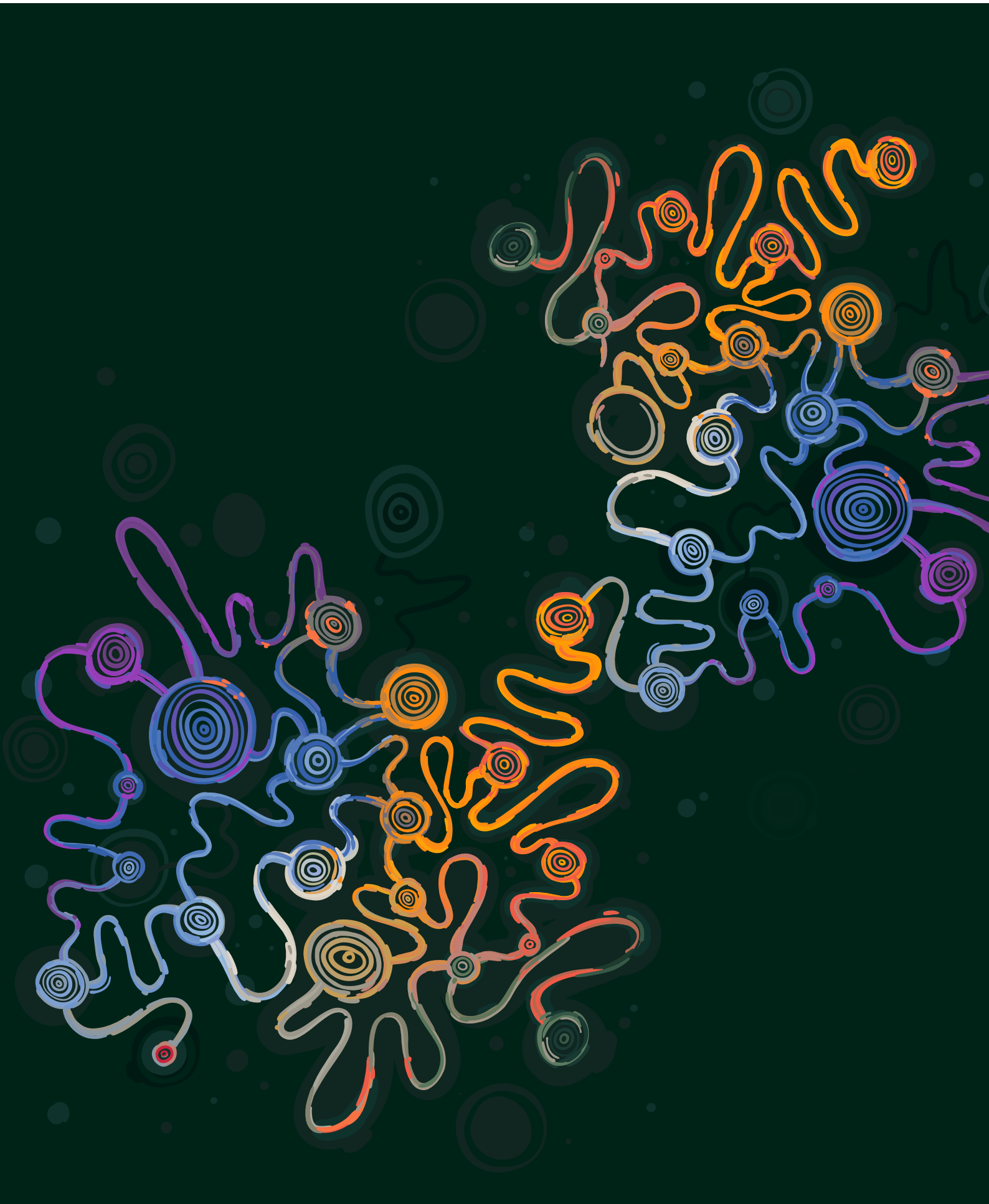

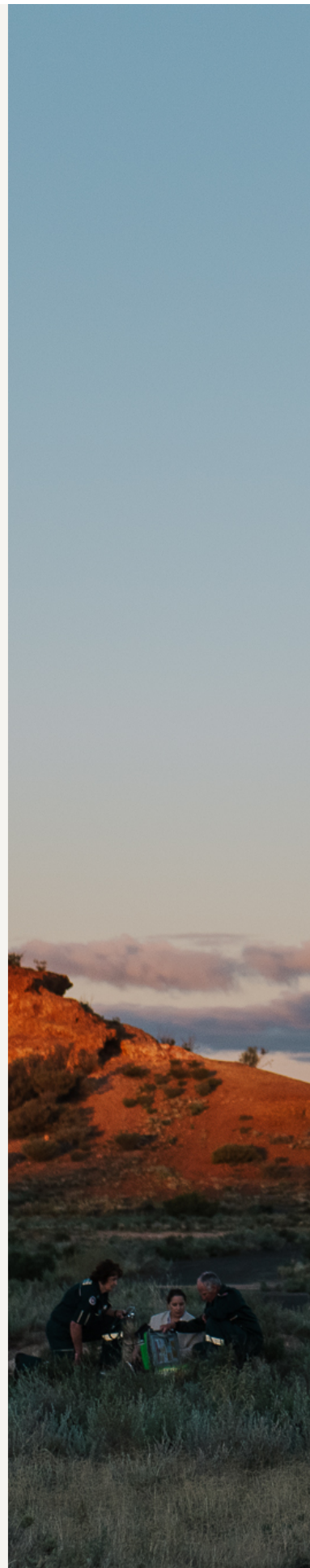
Acknowledgement of Country

Reconciliation Milestone

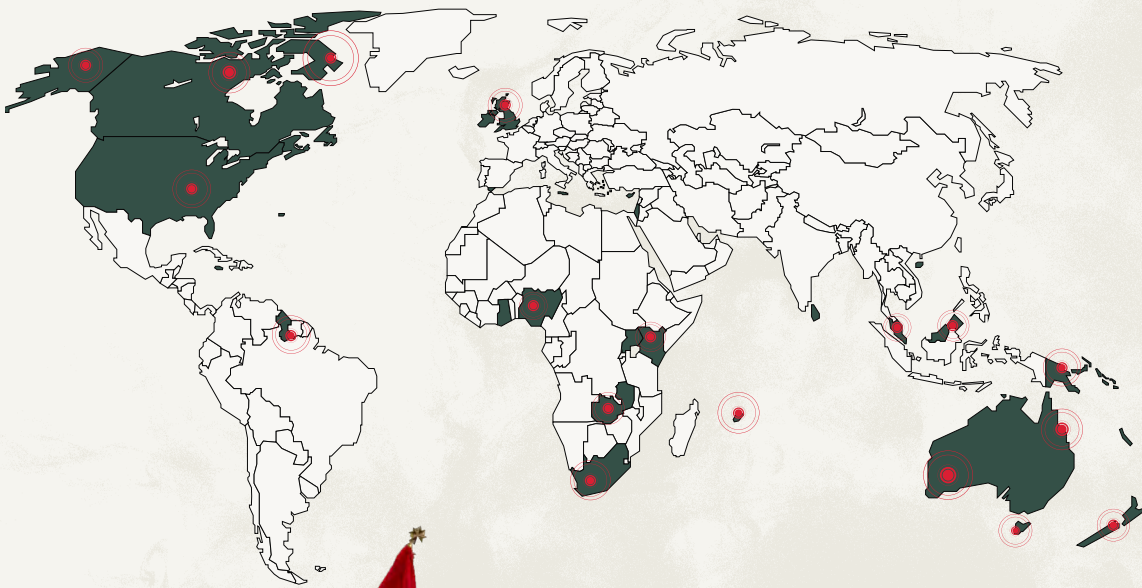
St John WA launched its “Reflect” Reconciliation Action Plan during the year, an event attended by more than 200 people in person, with people from 42 locations across the State tuning in online.

The Order of St John: Our work in 2022-23

Welcome to the inaugural Order of St John Commandery of Western Australia Yearbook, which celebrates the history and global connection of the Order and its members, and reflect upon the year invested here in WA.

The Yearbook envelopes St John WA's Annual Report, covering the business of the year, and the Impact Report, which highlights the impact the business of St John WA provides to and with the community of WA.

The Order of St John Commandery in WA acknowledges it is a thread in the rich historical tapestry of the Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of Saint John of Jerusalem, an international and modernising community united in charitable purpose. The Order of St John's vision is to enhance the reach and effectiveness of St John globally through focus on the mottoes: Pro Fide 'For the Faith' and Pro Utilitate Hominum 'For the Service of Humanity'.

The year 2023 marked the 140th anniversary of St John Australia's continuous service to the community, a testament to the bonds of connection that anchor the operations and reflect core values central to the Australian ethos. St John started in Australia in

Victoria through the pioneering spirit of Dr James Neild in 1883, nine years before St John opened in WA. Thus, St John WA now commemorates 131 years since the introduction of the inaugural first aid course.

St John WA is positioned as one of the five distinguished Commanderies within the global Order of St John family, it stands alongside the Isle of Man, the Bailiwick of Guernsey, the Bailiwick of Jersey, and the Commandery of Ards in Northern Ireland. Ties extend further to another 39 regions (11 Priories and 27 Associations) across Europe, the Americas and Asia Pacific, all integral parts of the cohesive St John International family, plus across the network of all states and territories in Australia.

I am proud to be part of an organisation with strong values and a strong dedication to do our very best for the sick and the poor, for the communities we serve and for our team members working for St John around the world. I know I can count on your support. Whether we are in Western Australia, Zimbabwe, Malaysia, Wales or Fiji, we are all #OneStJohn.

International

Investiture of the Governor into the Order of St John

January 31 marked a significant occasion as the Governor of Western Australia, His Excellency the Honourable Chris Dawson AC APM, and his wife, Mrs Darrilyn Dawson, gathered with family members for an investiture ceremony that held profound importance. The Governor was formally inducted as a Knight of Grace in the Order of St John and was further honoured with the installation as the Knight Commander of the Order of St John, Commandery of Western Australia, a prestigious recognition within the Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of St John of Jerusalem.

The appointment as Knight Commander follows a tradition set by previous WA Governors, underscoring the distinguished role that the Governor undertakes in representing St John at official events. Beyond the ceremonial aspects, the position grants the Governor the authority to induct new members into the Order and bestow promotions, a responsibility that holds great significance within the Order's hierarchy.

The Order of St John is a globally renowned international charity, with a network close to 300,000 dedicated volunteers worldwide. With a rich history made up of older history from 900 years ago, and a newer history from 1877, the Order plays a pivotal role in positively impacting communities by promoting physical and mental health, as well as resilience across much of the globe. Operating in more than 44 global locations, the Order of St John delivers vital healthcare services and programs, resonating with the core values of compassion and humanitarianism.

Year after year, St John organisations across the world train millions of people in essential first aid skills and other healthcare activities. These charitable, not for profit and purposeful bodies have far-reaching impacts in delivering diverse healthcare services and

initiatives to millions of beneficiaries, underscoring an unwavering commitment to the service of humanity.

In a separate event that showcased the Governor's commitment to his role as Knight Commander, His Excellency and Mrs Dawson visited St John WA's State Office in Belmont on a rainy Tuesday, June 6. The Governor was warmly received by St John WA Group CEO Kevin Brown and various heads of operations and clinical services.

During a comprehensive tour lasting 1.5 hours, the Governor was familiarised with the Emergency stream's operations. His Excellency commended the dedication of volunteers and professionals within the organisation, especially those working in regional and remote areas. The visit further solidified the Governor's commitment to the cause, underscoring the critical role organisations like St John play in ensuring the well-being of communities and individuals, particularly in times of distress.

At St John WA's Investiture to the Order held in April, the Governor as His Majesty, King Charles III's representative and Knight Commander of the Order paid tribute to volunteerism.



“Volunteering is one of the five core priorities that I’ve added to the normal role of Governor, making sure the work of our volunteers is both supported and recognised,” the Governor said.

“Indeed the King, as our monarch is the strongest advocate and as a key part of his upcoming Coronation, he has announced what he has termed ‘The Big Help Out’ and that’s going to be held the day after his coronation in May, encouraging members of the public to try their hand at volunteering to help build kinder, more connected communities.

“So don’t underestimate the difference that you are making, not only with those that you working with and around you, your families and your loved ones and supporters, but the difference you’re making, whether you’re a full time professional, part-time or a volunteer, you’re making a big difference in people’s lives in our communities.

“And those achievements have saved lives. They’ve driven improvement, developed individual spirit, increased community resilience, through furthering knowledge and skills. These all contribute to continue to uphold the values and the missions of the Order of St John.

“And we know that the people of Western Australia are thankful to you. We’ve benefited greatly from your dedicated work, and we know the sacrifices that have been made. So on behalf of Western Australians, let me convey that thanks to you.

Welcome to the first Yearbook to the Members of the Order of St John Commandery in Western Australia, a collector's booklet which reflects the renewed commitment to open communication and transparency across the diverse length and breadth of St John WA, bringing zestful collaboration and connection for the wonderful St John WA Order Members.

From the inaugural first aid course delivered by St John in Western Australia back in 1892, the organisation and its Members has shaped the way of life in Perth and the regions.

This year was no different and it was heartening to see the St John WA community grow to 64,454 people including 631 Order Members, 3130 paid and 4288 volunteer team members, and 56,405 spontaneous first responders. Together they supported 771,719 people to access care when they needed it most, and provided first aid training, sales and engagement activities to 361,015 people – including 235,560 young people.

This is a connection through about 1.2 million points in the single year, from Mathieson Jacoby's pioneering spirit set down when he started St John WA in 1892.

This year the Commandery welcomed 60 new admissions, acknowledged six promotions and 12

Commandery Commendations. The annual Investiture ceremony in April provided an opportunity to acknowledge the exceptional service of team Members from across the length and breadth of WA, all dedicated to purpose: To serve humanity and build resilient communities through the relief of sickness, distress, suffering and danger.

We all had the great privilege of welcoming the new Members to the Order at the event, and we noted at the time they are joining during a time of growth. Everyone's enthusiasm sets the Order up to grow as a contemporary, relevant, vibrant and meaningful organisation actively supporting services to the WA community.

St John WA also welcomed new leadership to the organisation this year and members may have noticed a change in activity particularly since the 2022 Annual General Meeting, which was underpinned by a new Order Engagement Plan developed to honour the important role of Order Members. We look forward to building on this plan for 2024.

The Group Board took the turn of the new year as an opportunity to refresh its approach to Members and stakeholders and launched Board Communiques, published shortly after each meeting, to invite Order

Members into the Boardroom, to better clarify the role of the Board and how that differs from the role of the Group CEO. The Communiqués provide authentic and timely insight into Board decision points and discussions, all explicitly linked to the Board role.

This was supported by monthly electronic newsletters to Members which provided information on the activities of St John WA, and captured highlights from around the world to ensure Members were

meaningfully connected to, and informed of, the far-reaching contribution the working Order of Chivalry at a global level.

On a more personal and deep engagement level, at the end of the financial year, two engagement sessions had been completed with another two planned, and 73 Members had participated in a strategic direction survey. Thank you for this genuine commitment to the future of St John WA.



Each engagement session featured both a face-to-face option and option to dial-in remotely for Members unable to attend in person.

A highlight was an inaugural regional engagement session in Bunbury with 25 Members attending in person from Collie to Augusta, and another 30 joining online. It was a privilege for the Group Board to hear first-hand from this group of dedicated and passionate Members whose commitment to St John WA has remained steadfast in some cases for many decades. Feedback gathered in these sessions has already impacted decision-making at Board level.

When taken in concert, the Communiques, newsletters, in-person and online engagement activities have provided regular touchpoints to ensure all Members are kept informed of important work being undertaken to address necessary advancements to the Constitution in keeping with strong governance expectations of a modern business. This reflects the challenge set by International Secretary General, Susan le Jeune d'Allegeershecque to all 44 charitable St John entities around the world to make a strong stance on governance.

The engagements all geared towards helping the Board execute its role of setting the Group strategic direction, and ensuring voting Members were informed and engaged in their role, including rights and decisions:

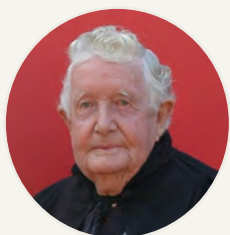

Bevan McInerney OAM CStJ

Bevan Francis McInerney spent 76 years with St John WA (SJWA), which included being part of the earliest Ambulance Brigade in York in 1946, followed by Midland and Coolgardie. He was part of the executive committee of the ambulance's Railway Centre from 1960, and a regular – and successful - competitor in railway first aid competitions.

He was promoted to District Superintendent recognising more than 40 years of dedication, and in 1990 became the first non-medical Commissioner. Bevan was awarded Life Membership of the Association in 1964, admitted to the Order of St John as a Serving Brother in 1975, promoted to Officer in 1977 and to Commander in 1984. He had the Order service medal and six bars and was also awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia in June 1991. He retired at age of 65 but maintained his interest in all Commandery activities.

Douglas Gildersleeve CStJ

Douglas Gildersleeve spent his life in the service of St John since joining as a cadet in 1938. His devotion saw him rise to Divisional Staff until 1976, during which he founded the Gosnells and Melville Divisions. He also joined the ambulance service, helping found the Victoria Park and Melville Sub Centres as a volunteer until 1967.

Douglas spent 28 years as an instructor and then the vast majority of his 70-year service as a member of the Operations and Community Care branches. His shining example as a quiet achiever led him to first being admitted as a Serving Brother to the Order in 1964, with the promotion of Officer Brother in 1997 and eventually becoming Commander (Brother) in 2007. Douglas also received the Service Medal and bar, and received a Commandery Commendation in 1974.

Margaret Cockman OAM CStJ joined the Wanneroo Division of Event Health Services in 1968 and went on to an illustrious service, which included roles as the Sub Centre Chairperson, Regional Superintendent for Perth Northern Region, and Divisional Manager of Wanneroo Division. Beyond her contributions to St John, she was involved with numerous community organisations and was recognised with an OAM and as a Freeman of both the City of Wanneroo and Joondalup.

Hazel Goldacre OStJ

Hazel Goldacre was the first female Commissioner in Australia and was WA's next District Commissioner. Hazel moved to Australia in 1969 after initially trained as a Registered Nurse in the UK and was a pivotal figure in the development of St John services in WA. She established training centres in Morley and Melville and led significant reforms in Event Health Services, notably standardised training and centralised funding for volunteers. Despite retiring in 1997, Hazel continued her dedicated service to St John WA.
